WHAT IS COP?

The UN Annual Climate Change Conference / Conference of Parties

Brings together world leaders, ministers and negotiators to agree on how to address climate change

3 MAIN GOALS

RE: PARIS AGREEMENT

- keep global average temperature rise to 'well below' 2°C and pursue efforts to limit the rise to 1.5°C above pre-industrial levels
- adapt to climate change and build resilience
- align finance flows with 'a pathway towards low greenhouse gas emissions and climate-resilient development'.

ST GLOBAL STOCKTAKE



The Paris Agreement's Global Stocktake assesses the global response to the climate crisis every 5 years

First-ever stocktake to conclude during COP28



Most extensive assessment of global action on climate change to date



Synthesis Report released in Sep 2023

- Key finding: World is far from achieving Paris Agreement's goals
- Outlines key areas where immediate action should occur and pathways for systems transformations

1 ST YOUTH CLIMATE CHAMPION (YCC)



The YCC closes the gap between the COP presidency and its youth stakeholders

- Mainstreaming youth participation and voices
 - Coordination between youth and governments



Amplifies all voices under age of 35

• Emphasis on vulnerable communities



1st YCC: H.E. Shamma Al Mazrui (she/her)

- Minister of Community Development UAE
 - Working with local and global stakeholders
 - Creating mechanisms to fund youth innovators in the field



BLUE ZONE

Managed by the UNFCCC. Critical space for decisionmaking and negotiations.

Includes negotiation zones and pavilion zones.*

- Parties (Country negotiators)
- Observers (NGOs, IGOs, UN Agencies)
- Media
- World Leaders

*Requires a badge: only UNFCCCaccredited participants have access.

GREEN ZONE

Delivered by the COP host country (UAE). Hub of collaboration and inspiration to promote public engagement.

Open to civil society.

Exhibits, events, activities, booths, and displays.

- Civil Society
- Private Sector
- NGOs
- Arts & Media

Pavilions

An area in the Blue Zone where Parties or Observer Organisations have their own space.

Small rooms or booths where they can:

- Host events
- Showcase research and expertise
- Open informal discussions

Youth Space

For the second time there will be a Children & Youth Pavilion in the Blue Zone.

Entirely led by young people, youth-led networks and NGOs.

- Discussion, education, briefings
- Opportunity for youth to engage directly with world decisionmakers and delegates



Host countries change each year





The host country appoints a president to lead the talks: They play an important role in consulting with governments and other stakeholders, providing leadership and vision and – ultimately – brokering the agreements generated.
